Respected performance artist Guy de Cointet, known for his remarkable use of text and his outrageous set designs, returns to L.A. to stage a one-hour play titled *Five Sisters*. The story revolves around the reunion of four sisters in their family home in Tustin. One of the sisters, Maria, has inhabited the house since the parents died years ago. Another sister, Yvonne, is a painter living a few miles away by the ocean. Rachel has just moved to Escondido, and Dolly is an executive in L.A. The sisters get together to discuss family, emotional and professional matters, as well as to relax. Featuring Mary Ann Duganne, Helen Mendez, Peggy Margaret and Jane Zingale, the California tone of the play is enhanced by lights and sets by artist Eric Orr.
