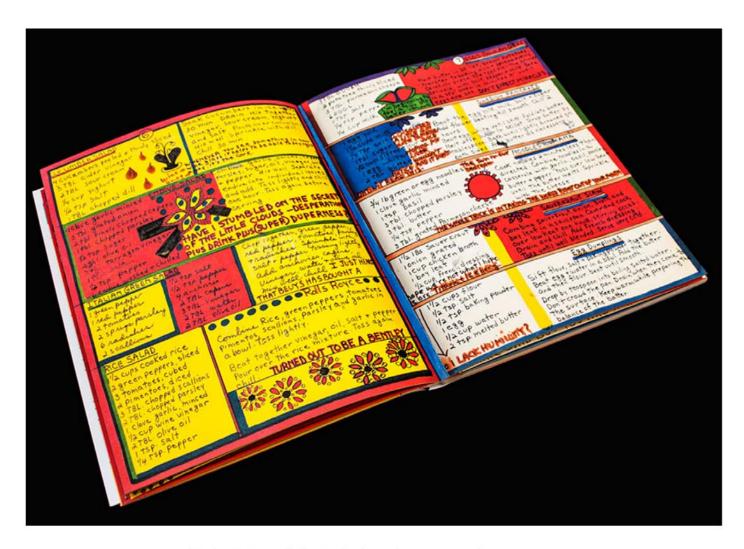

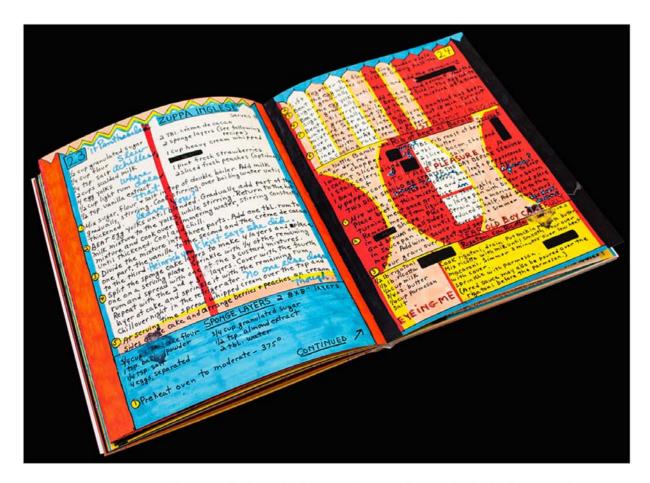
Picture Piece / 'Never Cry While You Cook': the Art of Dorothy lannone's Recipe **Book**

A new book publishes the prominent feminist artist's recipes for Sauce Madeira, gazpacho and beef wellington

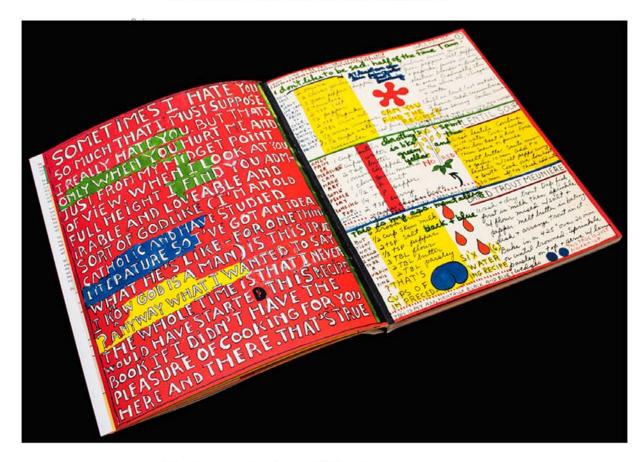
Dorothy lannone's A Cookbook was created in 1969 and features hand-written recipes and patterned drawings in her idiosyncratic style. As well as recipes, the book contains personal reflections. 'I've got the papers and we can get married now. I don't think I want to anymore' accompanies a recipe for Sauce Madeira; instructions for preparing gazpacho note that 'At least one can turn pain to colour'; while lentil soup appears with the thought, 'Dorothy's spirit is like this: green and yellow'. A new edition of the artist's cookbook, published by JRP|Editions, has just been released.



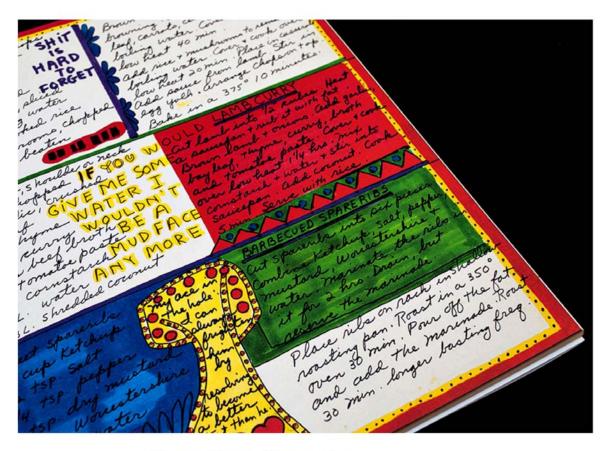
'I'm beginning to feel a tiny bit better', one note reads.



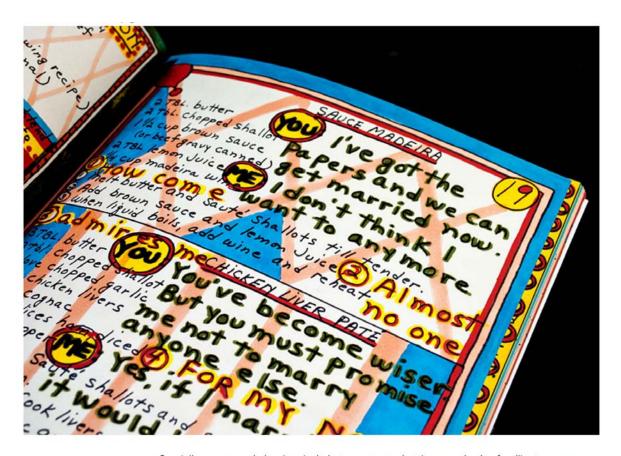
