Torbjørn Rødland's new exhibition at Serpentine Sackler Gallery will take on the disruptive tactile quality of his photography.

Viscous and hairy, the Norwegian photographer Torbjørn Rødland's work is always unsettling. He creates highly composed, naturalistic still life works: an apple submerged in gunge, a Stanley knife curving around a pregnant belly, a hairy orange, strawberries floating in milk. *Torbjørn Rødland: The Touch That Made You*, opens at the Serpentine's Sackler Gallery on 29 September and will take the disruptive, tactile quality of Rødland's photography as its departure.
